- **1. Welcome, Invocation, and Call to Order** The meeting was called to order by President Shane Turney at 6:38 p.m. Pat Prescot offered the invocation.
- **2**. **Adopt Agenda** Shane Turney, President Bob Cavanaugh motioned to adopt the agenda, seconded by Roland Best, motion carried unanimously.

- 3. Consent Agenda Shane Turney, President
  - a. Executive Committee Board Meeting Minutes November 9, 2017
  - b. Financial Statement

Pat Prescott motioned to approve the consent agenda, seconded by Bennie Heath, motioned carried unanimously.

- **4. Budget and Audit Committee Report** Edward Riggs, Treasurer, reported that the Budget & Audit Committee met on Thursday, March 8<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 p.m. to view the financials, audit contract, grant funding, indirect cost and the first glance at the budget.
- **5. Audit Contract for FY 18/19** Jenny Miller, Finance Director, introduced Robbie Bittner, Senior Manager from RSM. Robbie communicated matters related to the planned scope and timing of the audit contract for year end of June 30, 2018. The preliminary audit field work has been scheduled for the week of June 11st and the final field work commencing the week of August 20<sup>th</sup>.

Ed Riggs motioned to approve the audit contract for fiscal year 18/19, seconded by Jay Bender, motion carried unanimously.

**6.** Resolution to become member of the Municipal Insurance Trust of North Carolina – Jenny Miller, Finance Director, stated by becoming members the cost of insurance will reduce by \$6,000 yearly.

Roland Best motioned to approve resolution, seconded by Pat Prescott, motion carried unanimously.

- **7.** Record Retention and Disposition Schedule Jenny Miller, Finance Director Bennie Heath motioned to approve record retention schedule, seconded by Roland Best, motion carried unanimously.
- **8. New Member** Matthew Livingston, Executive Director, stated he conducted a retreat with the Town of Snow Hill, which helped encourage the town to become members. The town has paid the full ECC dues and seek approval of membership.

  Jay Bender motioned to approve membership, seconded by Pat Prescott, motion carried unanimously.
- 9. Staff Request Matthew Livingston, Executive Director, requested a 5% pay increase and retroactive pay back to November 7<sup>th</sup>, 2017, for Chad Davis, Community Planner, for completing his ACIP designation. This request is based on a precedent increased offered to an employee in 2016 for the same designation who is no longer employed with ECC. Patrick Flanagan, Planning Director, stated this is a stringent award in continuing education and will help the department with competing with grants in the region.

Bennie Heath motioned to approve request for increased compensation due to new credentials, seconded by Chris Roberson, motioned carried unanimously.

- **10.** Personnel Policy Pay and Classification Plan Report Matthew Livingston, Executive Director, stated the need to upgrade ECC personnel policy and to have a pay classification study completed. The market has changed since the last update and this will help ECC be more competitive in hiring and retaining employees. The plan should be completed in the next 45 days.
- **11. ECC Legislative Lunch and Learn Event Update** Matthew Livingston, Executive Director, stated he was excited about the Legislative Lunch and Learn Event on March 14<sup>th</sup>, at the Flame Catering. Matthew stated he would like to start a committee to help plan this event in the future, to get more people's voices, guidance to grow and improve the event. The Executive Committee requested a list of suggested topics to be emailed out.
- **12. Visioning Session** Matthew Livingston stated that ECC is conducting a Visioning Session on April 5<sup>th</sup> at Spirit Center of Excellence. Tours of the Spirit Aerosystem will start at 4. This session will help construct a foundation and to provide direction of ECC. Patrick Flanagan, Planning Director, stated the session will help ECC better serve its members. Dinner will be served at 5 and the brainstorming will start sharply at 6:00 p.m. Invite will be sent next week.
- **13. Executive Director Report** Matthew Livingston, Executive Director, stated he has conducted presentations about the CEDS and wants to conduct more, at least in every county. He then referred everyone to the update in the agenda packet.

#### 14. Member Comments

Shane Turney stated that if members have not been through a New Member Orientation to contact Executive Director to set one up. Also to think of the COG not "What have they done for me?, but to think "What have I asked the COG to do?"

Roland Best praised the Ethics Training offered by ECC for newly elected officials.

Bennie Heath stated Greene County Boys Basketball team will also be heading to state conference.

Arthur Robinson stated the Town of Hookerton has opened their new town hall.

#### INTRA-REGIONAL COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND MEMBERSHIP OF THE NORTH CAROLINA ASSOCIATION OF REGIONAL COUNCIL DIRECTORS, INC. (A NC NON-PROFIT CORPORATION), HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS THE NC ASSOCIATION OF REGIONAL COUNCILS, ESTABLISHES POLICIES WITH RESPECT TO THE ISSUE OF TERRITORIAL INTEGRITY AND JOINT AND MUTUAL CONSULTATION AND AGREEMENT ON COOPERATIVE PROJECTS SPANNING THE BOUNDARIES OF SUB-STATE REGIONS IN NORTH CAROLINA

**WHEREAS**, The North Carolina Association of Regional Councils is the designated regional forum for North Carolina 's Regional Planning Commissions and Councils of Government formed pursuant to (GS 143-341 or).

**WHEREAS**, North Carolina's Regional Councils are charged with the mission of delivering regional services to member units of local government;

WHEREAS, in the course of carrying out their work programs, North Carolina's Regional Councils may share resources and capacity that will enhance the statewide delivery of local, regional, state or federal services;

**WHEREAS**, it is the desire of the North Carolina Association of Regional Councils to promote a defined set of policies to provide a protocol for statewide service delivery, including jointly sponsored and executed projects and defining issues of regional importance;

#### NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That the North Carolina Association of Regional Councils hereby establishes a policy that enhances its value by sharing member resources and capacity to deliver services to the State of North Carolina.
- 2. That the North Carolina Association of Regional Councils hereby endorses Regional Councils, or their affiliated or subsidiary organizations, to carry out activities in regions outside of their boundaries with consent when those services are to the benefit of the region and the state. That the terms "affiliated organization" and " subsidiary organization" shall be generally construed to mean any legal entity, created under any state or federal statute, formed for the purpose of carrying out and fulfilling a program of work, which organization or entity is housed within, is provided staff by, or shares more than a majority of its membership or board members with a Regional Council as denoted above.
- 3. This agreement does not supplant previous agreements.
- 4. The services provided as presented in Attachment A are subject to Change by the individual Regional Councils.

5. That this resolution shall be in effect from and after the date of its passage.

## 10. Executive Director Report

- In April, held region wide visioning session at the Global Trans-park in Kinston. The purpose of this meeting was for ECC to get a broad overview of those challenges and needs that all our communities are facing. One of our objectives was to get a broad representative view of the entire region. We believe this was accomplished, as the meeting was well attended with participants representing all nine counties. Staff is compiling the results of the session and will be presented at the next General Membership Board meeting in June.
- The General Membership Board Meeting in June, will focus on taking those needs and challenges and developing a strategy on how the Eastern Carolina Council can address specific areas of concern or challenges within the communities. The information we are gathering will then be used to develop a five-year strategic action plan.
- Working with Hillary Sherman and the EDA to put on a regional Economic Development Summit. At this time, no date has been set but we are thinking late August or September.
- Ongoing grant administration with Project Volt or New Bern City Market. The bids will be open in May and awarded to the lowest-most responsive bidder.
- ECC is also expected to administer a grant for James Sprunt Community College for the expansion of their new Nursing Training facility.
- ECC is assisting with grant applications through EDA for the Gallants Channel Initiative. This
  is the site that has been acquired and considered to be the future home of a greatly
  expanded NC Maritime Museum. We are working on round two of the grant process.
- Submitted a PARTF Grant application for the Town of Hookerton on May 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Assisted Morehead City with their PARTF application and completed their Parks and Recreation Master Plan.
- Held Quarterly Managers Meeting on May 2<sup>nd,</sup> the major topic was water and sewer and grant revenues both current and expected future.
- Created a Legislative Results Committee, purpose of the committee is to maximize our effectiveness as a region working with our legislators. We have a regional Legislative agenda but this committee can help with all regional legislative affairs and will help plan and coordinate our Annual Legislative Lunch and Learn.
- On May 30<sup>th</sup> the Statewide Regional Directors Association will have a legislative day beginning at 8:30 a.m. in Raleigh at the legislative building and concluding with a reception from 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. at the NC Museum of History. There are a number of regional issues and bills that we are working on as an association, that if passed will benefit Eastern North Carolina.
- The Director will be attending the Annual Southeastern Regional Directors Institute and New Directors training from May 18-22 in Kingsport, Tennessee.
