North Carolina HOUSING FINANCE AGENCY

NC Housing Finance Agency has proposed that a total of \$8.8 million will be made available for the 2024 Urgent Repair Program (URP24). Program funding enables recipient organizations to provide deferred, forgiven loans of up to \$12,000 for emergency home repairs and modifications to very low-income owner-occupied homes. Eligible households are those with 1+ fulltime household member with special needs (e.g., elderly, disabled, and/or Veteran fulltime household members or

a 6-year-old child (or under 6) living in the home with lead hazards). Household incomes cannot exceed 50% of area median income.

Nonprofit organizations, local governments, and regional councils of government with the technical capacity to manage residential construction projects are eligible to apply. Eligible applicants must cover service areas with a population of 5,000 or greater. The maximum funding amount is \$264,000 for projects serving 2 or more counties in their entirety, and \$132,000 for projects serving 1 county. ICMA - Civic Plus: White Paper, "*Everyone Online: Paving the way with accessible municipal websites.*" More than 1 in 4 people in the US have some level of disability. To meet ADA requirements and to ensure key information is available online to all, municipalities must develop a website strategy. Automation, staffing restrictions, operational procedures and compliance levels should be considered.

Even simple website updates can result in missing links, data errors or poor readability, which are accessibility issues that can impact all visitors. Also consider features that are:

- Difficult for people who are sight impaired.
- Challenging for people who are hearing impaired.
- Requiring duplicate efforts.

At the very least, an accessibility solution should offer:

- Legal protection.
- Automated accessibility remediation.
- Accessibility certification.
- PDF accessibility.

AAA -Medicare Part D Enrollment Assistance: Last month during its annual open enrollment period, (which began on Oct. 15th and runs until Dec. 7th), AAA staff assisted Jones County and Craven County providers by assisting community members by reviewing and updating their Medicare health and drug plans for 2024. AAA staff worked with NC Senior Health Insurance Information Program
