ECC TRANSPORTATION WORKSHOP FOR ELECTED OFFICIALS,
ESPECIALLY NEWLY ELECTED OFFICIALS AND STAFF - "NCDOT
STIP/SPOT 101" on Feb. 13, 9:00-12:00: ECC Rural Planning Organization (RPO) staff will provide a transportation training session on Feb. 13th in the ECC Board Room.

This training will provide an overview of NCDOT's State Transportation Improvement



Plan (STIP), the SPOT Prioritization process, which is used to add new projects to the STIP. In addition, other topics will include a summary of the Strategic Transportation Improvements law, the process to create a new STIP, and the role played by a Rural Planning Organization (RPO). And finally, there will be discussion of the Prioritization process that takes a new transportation project from concept to construction. North Carolina's prioritization method is known as SPOT, which also will be reviewed step by step.
