

ECC is hosting a Digital Inclusion Plan Listening Session for all residents of Greene County at the Greene County Senior Center (at 104 Greenridge Road, Snow Hill) on Friday, November 15th from 11:00 a.m. until 12:00 noon. This is part of ECC's partnership with North Carolina State University's Institute for Emerging Issues (NCSU IEI) and the NCSU Friday Institute to develop a Regional Digital Inclusion Plan for our 9-county region. Developing a digital inclusion plan will help support efforts to increase broadband access and use and computer literacy. We would love to hear from Greene County residents about their experiences using technology and getting online.

Listening sessions for Craven, Jones, Lenoir, Pamlico, and Wayne counties are also in the works. Carteret, Duplin, and Onslow counties have digital inclusion plans; therefore, listening sessions are not anticipated for these counties, but updated data for all nine counties will be included in the regional plan.

<u>National Alzheimer's Awareness Month</u>. National Alzheimer's Disease Awareness Month aims to make the public more aware of the disease, the impact it has on our communities, and the impact it has on the individual and their family members.

Alzheimer's Disease is the most common form of dementia among older adults. According to the Alzheimer's Association, there are more than 5.7 million people in the US currently living with Alzheimer's. There are 180,000 individuals 65 years and older living with Alzheimer's in NC. This number is expected to reach 210,000 by the year 2025.

Alzheimer's disease is the 6th leading cause of death in the US. Individuals diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease live an average of 4-8 years after diagnosis, but can live as long as 20 years, depending on the individual's age, health, and progression of the disease. This November, Eastern Carolina Council Area Agency on Aging would like to honor the spirit of each person, each family, and communities supporting individuals and family members living with Alzheimer's or another form of dementia.

How Can You Raise Awareness of Alzheimer's Disease?

- 1. Educate yourself and others about Alzheimer's disease.
- 2. Honor and support a caregiver.
- 3. Take a walk to help end Alzheimer's and to honor those who have been diagnosed with the disease.
- 4. Wear purple for Alzheimer's during November to show support to those affected by the disease.

As a caregiver, join a support group, or attend a workshop - to be of assistance in taking care - to give care.
