Grants

US Water Alliance

ECC staff recently met with staff from US Water Alliance to learn about their organization. The US Water Alliance is designated a national Environmental Finance Center (EFC), which provides technical assistance to underserved communities with the goal of obtaining federal funds for water infrastructure (including drinking, sanitary, and stormwater).

Direct technical assistance includes state revolving fund readiness support, funding application support, and post-award advising. The organization also assists with "Field Building", which includes education and resource development for water issues.

Updated County Tier Designations

The NC Department of Commerce has released its 2026 County Tier Designations. Link to memo is HERE. The tier system divides NC counties by



Economic Distress Rank, which affects access to state economic development programs.

This system is based on relative levels of economic distress, with 40 spots for Tier 1, 40 spots for Tier 2, and 20 spots for Tier 3. Tier 3 is relatively least distressed, whereas Tier 1 is most distressed. Tier level is determined by the sum of four factors. These factors are 1 to 100 rankings for the following variables:

- Average unemployment rate
- Median household income
- Percentage growth in population
- Adjusted property base per capita

Jones County is the only county within the ECC region to change tiers from 2025 to 2026, moving from Tier 2 to a more distressed Tier 1. This is due to changes in the unemployment and median household income factors.

The ECC region's 2026 County Tier Designations are as follows:

- Tier 3 (least distressed): Carteret
- Tier 2: Craven, Duplin, Onslow, Pamlico
- Tier 1 (most distressed): Greene, Jones, Lenoir, Wayne

2026 Low Income Home and Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)



North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services has received federal funds for the 2026 LIHEAP. The purpose of this program is to assist households with the cost of home heating, with one-time payments going directly to heating vendors.

Households with an individual at least 60 years or older with a disability who receive services through the Division of Aging can apply for this program staring on December 10 if they did not receive automatic renewal. Notices for automatic renewal were provided in November.

Grant cycle opens soon for North Carolina Land & Water Fund (NCLWF)



The NCLWF, within the NC Department of Natural and Cultural Resources, prioritizes drinking water and protecting natural habitats. Eligible applicants for their grant programs include local governments and conservation nonprofits.

There are four regular cycle grant programs:

- Land acquisition of eligible properties through purchase or perpetual conservation agreements.
- Restoration of natural water resources, including streams, wetlands, floodplains, living shorelines, and related projects.
- Innovative projects for managing stormwater aimed at improving water quality.
- Planning to reduce surface water pollution.

Matches are recommended but not required.

The grant cycle opens January 15, 2026, and the application deadline is March 1, 2026.

FY2026 Brownfields Grants

The EPA has released guidelines for multiple brownfields grants. These include the Multipurpose Grant, Community-wide Assessment Grant, Assessment Coalition Grant, Community-wide Assessments Grant for States and Tribes, and Cleanup Grant.

Applications are due on January 28, 2026.

North Carolina Resilient Coastal Communities Program (RCCP)



RCCP is managed by NCDEQ's Division of Coastal Management. The purpose of this program is to provide financial and technical assistance for coastal resilience projects. Local governments in North Carolina's 20 coastal counties are eligible to apply. Within the ECC region, that includes Carteret, Craven, Onslow, and Pamlico counties and their municipalities.

This program is based on four phases. The first two phases are planning-related and concurrent, and they result in the creation of resilience strategy and project portfolio documents. Phase 3 includes engineering and design for selected projects, and Phase 4 consists of project implementation (construction). Participation in the first two phases is required for participation in the subsequent phases.

Phases 1 and 2 are awarded directly to approved contractors that assist communities. Phases 3 and 4 are awarded directly to communities.

There is no local match for this program.

This program is awarded annually. The 2025-2026 RCCP Cohort has already been awarded. Visit the links below for more information.
